## In the Library you will find:

- Books to borrow
- Rooms dedicated to collective work
- Wi-fi, Internet access, available upon authentication
- An Interlibrary Loan Service
- A photocopying and a printing service (buy a COREP Card or use your student's card)

## Online

- Search for documents in the online catalogue of the library
- Access from outside the library to electronic documentation depending on your reader's status and a list of academic sites freely accessible on the web
- Access the research publications repository of the University, from the Library portal
- Get connected with your ENT login/password to access other facilities: manage your library account (check the return date of the books you have borrowed), make searches, ask for books located in the storage rooms
- Follow what's going on in the world of research and documentation on the portal and the library's Facebook page.
- Ask a little help from a librarian via Rue des Facs, the virtual reference service of Paris universities.



## Printed collections

The library holds high quality collections in the domains studied in the university. You will find more than 180 000 books, out of which 45% are located in the reading rooms, 2 000 journals, all the doctoral thesis defended in the university, a selection of market studies, M2 dissertations.



## The Digital Library

Around 40 databases are available, 20 000 e-journals, 9 000 e-books, and the researchers' publications.

All this can be accessed from any PC in the Library. Some 20 databases are remotely accessible upon authentication (please activate your ENT account). Some databases are available only upon payment of a documentation fee (see the padlock sign).

## Helping you find the documents you're looking for

On the library documentary portal, you can make all your searches. Use the catalogue to search through all our printed and digital collections. Our powerful multi-database search engine saves you time: with one request it searches through several databases.

Quick training sessions are organized all the year around to help you handle our documentary resources with efficiency and help you with your searches (search method, definition of search subjects, organization of your bibliography ...). Please let us know about your training needs.

Librarians can help you: never hesitate to go and see them at the Information Desk.

## Using the Library with mutual respect

The library is first and foremost a space designed for quiet and efficient work. Please help us keeping it so for everyone by respecting these simple rules:

- Do not eat or drink (anything else than water) in the library to avoid staining documents
- Return your documents in due time (one day late equals a one-day borrowing suspension)
- Please be quiet in the reading rooms. If you have to work with other students, please make use of rooms dedicated to collective work (for at least 3 people, 2-hour periods).
